

EDPS Formal comments on the draft Commission Delegated Regulation amending Delegated Regulation (EU) 2019/1122 supplementing Directive 2003/87/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council as regards the functioning of the Union Registry

THE EUROPEAN DATA PROTECTION SUPERVISOR,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to Regulation (EU) No 2018/1725 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 23 October 2018 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Regulation (EC) No 45/2001 and Decision No 1247/2002/EC ('EUDPR')¹, and in particular Article 42(1) thereof,

HAS ADOPTED THE FOLLOWING FORMAL COMMENTS:

1. Introduction and background

- 1. On 17 December 2024, the European Commission consulted the EDPS on the draft Commission Delegated Regulation amending Delegated Regulation (EU) 2019/1122 supplementing Directive 2003/87/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council as regards the functioning of the Union Registry ('the draft delegated Regulation').
- 2. The objective of the draft delegated Regulation is to:
 - a. reflect in Delegated Regulation (EU) 2019/1122² changes stemming from Directive (EU) 2023/959³ and Decision of the EEA Joint Committee No 334/2023⁴;
 - introduce amendments to avoid negative impacts on operators that have no technical nor legal means to comply with previous EU Emissions Trading Systems (EU ETS) obligations;
 - c. ensure enforceability of Court rulings⁵; and
 - d. reflect transparency requirements stemming from Article 14(5) and (6) of Directive 2003/87/EC⁶.

- 3. The draft delegated Regulation is adopted pursuant to Article 19(3) of Directive 2003/87/EC⁷.
- 4. The present formal comments of the EDPS are issued in response to a consultation by the European Commission pursuant to Article 42(1) of EUDPR. The EDPS welcomes the reference to this consultation in Recital 12 of the draft delegated Regulation.
- 5. These formal comments do not preclude any additional comments by the EDPS in the future, in particular if further issues are identified or new information becomes available, for example as a result of the adoption of other related implementing or delegated acts⁸.
- 6. Furthermore, these formal comments are without prejudice to any future action that may be taken by the EDPS in the exercise of his powers pursuant to Article 58 of the EUDPR and are limited to the provisions of the draft delegated Regulation that are relevant from a data protection perspective.

2. Comments

- 7. The EDPS understands that the draft delegated Regulation would entail only limited processing of personal data. Namely, Annex II of the draft delegated Regulation entails the introduction of Table VII-II, in Annex VII to the Delegated Regulation (EU) 2019/1122, listing the details of the aircraft operator contact person. The competent authority or aircraft operator should provide such information to the relevant national administrator⁹. The information includes, among others, the contact person's address, phone number and email address. The EDPS welcomes the clarification in Annex II of the draft delegated Regulation that the address, phone number and e-mail address concern the business contact details of the respective contact person and not his or her private contact details.
- 8. Given the subject matter and the provisions of the draft delegated Regulation, which do not raise significant issues having regard to the protection of personal data, the EDPS has no further comments on the draft delegated Regulation.
